The decision makers of the French foreign policy under the fifth republic constitution.

- Abstract: The study sheds light on the official entities and influencers in foreign decision-making, and the management of French foreign policy under the semi-presidential system that emerged according to the Constitution of the Fifth Republic. The political system is one of the main determinants of foreign policy. The study aims at determining the role of the main institutions in making French foreign policy based on the powers conferred by the Constitution of the Fifth Republic issued on November 4, 1958.
